

RIGHTS & OPTIONS GUIDE

Student and employee survivors of sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking are afforded specific rights and options under the Clery Act, a federal law that guides campus prevention and response; this resource is an adaptation of a guide from the Clery website. The Title IX Coordinator may distribute this to survivors when a report has been made. You have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • notify campus authorities and law enforcement, • be assisted by campus authorities in notifying law enforcement, and • decline to notify 	<p>You will receive important information in writing, such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the importance of preserving evidence and how to do so, • confidential and free resources, • possible supportive measures or protective measures, • and a description of the disciplinary process. 	<p>You have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a prompt, fair, and impartial process, • conducted by officials who receive annual training on issues related to sexual assault, domestic/dating violence, and stalking <p>Both the complainant and the respondent have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have others present, • be accompanied to any related meeting or proceeding by an advisor of their choice, and • receive simultaneous notification of results.
