We are required by federal law to validate you meet the definition of an unaccompanied homeless youth.

- A local educational agency homeless liaison (or designee), as designated by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11432(g)(1)(J)(ii)). **Documentation required:** Signed letter on official letterhead from a school district liaison certifying homeless or at-risk status as of 07/01/2023 or after. **Current WC students cannot submit a high school letter.**
- The director (or designee) of an emergency or transitional shelter, street outreach program, homeless youth drop-in center, or other program serving individuals who are experiencing homelessness. **Documentation required:** Signed letter on official letterhead from a director of a qualifying shelter or program certifying homeless or at-risk status as of 07/01/2023 or after.
- The director (or designee) of a Federal TRIO program or a Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate program (GEAR UP) grant. **Documentation required:** Signed letter on official letterhead from a homelessness liaison certifying homeless or at-risk status as of 07/01/2023 or after.

If you are unable to provide the above documentation, you must correct the information you submitted on your 2024-2025 FAFSA, provide your parent(s) information, and resubmit your 2024-2025 FAFSA with you and your parent signature for re-processing.

SECTION C: CERTIFICATION

I certify that the information provided by me or my family member is true and complete to the best of my knowledge. I understand this request may require further documentation and is subject to the professional judgment of the Wilmington College Student One Stop Center staff. WHAT IS HOMELESS?

“Homeless” means lacking fixed, regular, and adequate housing. You may be homeless if you are living in shelters, parks, motels, hotels, public spaces, camping grounds, cars, abandoned buildings, or temporarily living with other people because you have nowhere else to go. Also, if you are living in any of these situations and fleeing an abusive parent, you may be considered homeless even if your parent would otherwise provide a place to live.

WHAT IS AN UNACCOMPANIED HOMELESS YOUTH?

Unaccompanied homeless youth are young people who lack safe, stable housing and who are not in the care of a parent or guardian. They may have run away from home or been forced to leave by their parents. Unaccompanied youth live in a variety of temporary situations, including shelters, the homes of friends or relatives, cars, campgrounds, public parks, abandoned buildings, motels, and bus or train stations. Unaccompanied youth do not receive financial support from their parents and do not have access to parental information.

WHO ARE MCKINNEY-VENTO SCHOOL DISTRICT LIAISONS?

Under Title VII, subtitle B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, every school district is required to designate a liaison for students experiencing homelessness. Homeless liaisons have a number of legal responsibilities under the Act, including identifying youth who meet the definition of homeless and are unaccompanied. The education subtitle of the McKinney-Vento Act is overseen by the U.S. Department of Education.
